Following intensive review of a self-study document and a site visit from a panel of external reviewers earlier this year, the USU bachelor's degree in Rangeland Resources has been re-accredited for a further 10-year term (2008-2018) by the Society for Range Management. USU thus retains its long-standing reputation as a "destination campus" for those wishing to become qualified to enter the profession of rangeland ecology and management. There are only nine universities in the USA that hold SRM accreditation and of those USU is the only one in the State of Utah. What this means for USU students is that earning the BS degree in Rangeland Resources brings immediate recognition from potential employers in the profession. Now that's a qualification worth having!
