Due to the remoteness of the park, I was also required to be certified in emergency medical training, fire fighting and search and rescue.

1992-Current:

I've been employed as a Conservation Officer with the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources Law Enforcement section for seventeen years. In 2006 I was promoted to the statewide training Sergeant. Within the course of my job duties I:

- Manage the field training program for all new officers
- Manage the budget in consultation with the Chief of LE

- Revise the field training program as needed
- Manage the in-service training of 65 current officers
- Maintain a network of training officers nationwide to find, assess and make available applicable law enforcement, forensic and investigative courses
- Maintain instructor status in firearms, K9, kayak and ice rescue
- Continue to work as a member of the Attorney General's office Child Abduction Response Team (CART)
- Recruit new officers to the law enforcement section by working in conjunction with Dr. Wolfe at Utah State University.

For the last ten years I have also taught part time at the State Police Academy.
